The main motto of this college is to provide quality education to Muslim Girls who have completed Higher Secondary Education. By integrating modern as well as Islamic education, one of our important objectives is to instill a sense of independence and self-confidence among our students to ensure their holistic upliftment. Education among girls strives to ensure development of their personality, which is likely to gradually help in mitigating social inequalities.

The college is adopting several creative methods to provide education that is practical in nature, and can be implemented in the real world. This is one of the first ever endeavor of its kind, in the state of West Bengal, to create a work force and Islamic scholars out of the Muslim female population.

## Diploma Course

### a. Kairat –e- Hafiz

Course duration: 1 year

- Minimum Qualification: Passed Bukhari Sharif Alema & Hafiza having knowledge of Urdu
- Training will be imparted by Female Qaris under the supervision of Gujarat's famous Qari Mufidul Islam Sahab

### b. Online Deeniyat Basic Course

Emphasis on reading Quran fluently to acquire basic concept on Deeniyat within 6 months' duration

### c. Online Deeniyat Certificate Course

A one-year duration course to build a strong foundation on Deeniyat. Reading the Quran with its meaning, Hadees, Aqaid, Masail, Islamic teachings and an overall knowledge of Arabic and Urdu language.

## Professional Certificate Course (Proposed)

- ◊ Apart from the aforementioned courses, Diploma and Certificate courses are being planned to be launched on subjects such as Nutrition, Methods of Child Education, Management and Computer subjects.
- ◊ Our college is also planning to start a Nursing College which would be beneficial for the female students of the state to get various employment opportunities.
- ◊ The institute has its own state of the art library to strengthen the process of imparting education. Group studies are practiced on a regular basis to inculcate inquisitiveness among students regarding education.

## Digital Lab

- ◊ The campus has a digital lab equipped with internet facilities to help students become digitally sound. Cyber security knowledge is also imparted along with regular computer courses.

## Social Curriculum

- ◊ Various social work projects are undertaken to build self-confidence, leadership qualities among the students as well as to enable them to propagate one's own views in a coherent manner. "Porar Ananda" (Enjoying the Studies), organized by the institute, has already earned appreciation by one of the leading media houses of West Bengal. In addition to this, workshops for environmental awareness are also organized.







## Admission Process

1. Name of the course: Diploma in Deeniyat Education.
2. Duration of the course: 2 years
3. Minimum educational qualification: A candidate who has completed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or an equivalent examination with 45% of marks is eligible for admission into D.D.Ed. program.
4. Admission procedure:  
Stage I: a) Admission Test (Written)  
Stage II: b) Tests to assess the students' personalities(Interview)  
Stage III: c) Interview for the parents  
Stage IV: d) Admission of the selected candidates



## Success of the College

- Every year almost 200 students are completing the “Diploma in Deeniyat Education” (D.D.Ed.) degree. They are considered as Muallimas or Islamic Scholars who are already appointed as teachers in the schools under Deeniyat Muallima College.
- Almost 40,000 students, out of which 20,000 are female students, are getting educated through Deeniyat Muazzam Maktab in West Bengal. D.M.C. is creating Deeniyat teachers who will impart Deen teachings to the girls above the age of 9 years. It will uphold the role of girls in the formation of an ideal society.
- Students passing out of Deeniyat Muallima College are teachers at Deeniyat Muazzam Maktab. Among them, many are appointed in English medium schools and missions as Deeniyat Teachers.
- The students will get immense opportunities to showcase their talents due to the huge infrastructural development by Deeniyat Muallima College and various organizations associated with it.
- The Alumni and Placement Cell of this institute is creating a lot of work opportunities for the students who are establishing themselves in various positions.

Howrah: Students of a college in Howrah have been carrying bags full of books in the areas around their institution to initiate children into reading, an opportunity that the pandemic has snatched away from many of them.

The books are for primary and middle school children who are mostly from government school areas. The bags, which are from school because of the pandemic, have been filled in the name of their reporting, how to read, a village teacher said.

The students of Deeniyat Muallima College in Santaragachi have been organising these book reading sessions for a couple of hours once every week.

## Solar power focus in Pratchi training

Pratchi, in collaboration with Deeniyat Muallima College in Howrah, is providing hands-on training in 10 youths from minority communities on use of solar panels, batteries, LED bulbs, SMD LED lights, BLED fans and C-spectrum UV LEDs for solar water purification. The project aims to promote "barefoot solar entrepreneurship" so that a livelihood opportunity is generated as well as make them self-sufficient in their daily activities also.

The primary focus is to train them for production of off-grid solar electricity utilizing solar applications in suburban and rural areas, and also make them aware about the daily-use rooftop of solar power to use fans, mobile chargers, water purifiers and for cooking. It will help them become self-reliant and, in the long run, can generate many livelihood options," said Usha Chaudhary, coordinator, special project, at Pratchi India Trust.

Physics Professor Parthasarathi Majumdar, one of the instructors of the pilot project, said the training involves use of basic electronic tools like multimeters, soldering iron and devices like diodes and transistors. Solar electronics specialist Sekhar Banerjee and Anam Mallick, an IT-trained electronic expert is helping him.

"The training programme will culminate in setting up of solar panels and associated equipment at an Angwandi, and a primary health-care centre so that these places get free power. The trainees can also think of start-up solar power firms in remote areas," said Majumdar.

Sonia Khatoon, geography honours student, said, "I would like to start a small business after learning this and also make use solar devices in my home because it is environment-friendly as well as saves a lot of money." Secretary of the college, SK Hyder Ali, said it would make the youth self-reliant and help in fight the climate crisis.
